Your AP Language and Composition teacher will collect your packet at the beginning of the school year and will be looking for completion of the assignment, for evidence of annotation (making notes, clarifications, and definitions on the article itself) and for your summary.**

NOTE: This assignment **SHOULD NOT** be done all in one day. We will be checking to see if the articles that you have chosen were published throughout the summer.
